<b>Summary:</b>	The Broward County <i>Get Ready! Your Child's First Teacher...You!</i> initiative will provide local families with greater access to quality early literacy education and experiences through the purchase of AWE Early Literacy Stations, development and implementation of a series of parenting workshops and family engagement events, and the creation of an early literacy public awareness campaign.

Grant funds will purchase and provide new library material for babies and toddlers, new parents and caregivers. Parents and caregivers will be encouraged to assist with collection development, and participate in reading campaigns, writers' workshops, parent child interaction programs using Lego Duplos, and infant and toddler board book publishing projects.

With grant funds, the Jacksonville Public Library will deliver pre-college (ABE/ESL/GED) instruction to at least 1,000 adults with the goal of transitioning into postsecondary education, vocational training and/or employment. Grant funds will make available GED instruction and educational software that integrates basic literacy instruction with workforce skills. Funding will also help support the expansion of classes into the Bradham Brooks Northwest Regional Library, a busy branch library serving an impoverished area of the city.

<b>Summary:</b>	<p>The Northeast Florida Library Information Network (NEFLIN) <i>Training for Library Staff to Better Serve Their Community</i> project will provide a comprehensive training program that will enhance the ability of library staff to better serve their community. The grant activities will provide high-demand training in multiple locations and formats to allow for the widest possible participation by library staff. The four activities that comprise this training program will be: staff training, interest groups, self-paced learning and a full-day technology conference.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Staff training will consist of a quarterly schedule of free face-to-face and online classes that are provided for library staff in Florida.</li><li>• Interest Groups will meet quarterly to provide a forum for library staff to network, share information and problem solve on topics of mutual concern.</li><li>• Self-paced learning will be provided by the items in NEFLIN's Lending Library. This collection of DVDs, CDs and books assist library staff in their professional development.</li><li>• Technology Conference will be a full-day event for library staff to help them keep current on new and emerging trends in technology.</li></ul>

**Summary:** The Panhandle Library Access Network (PLAN) *Training to Meet the Future* project will provide access to training for library staff and volunteers throughout the Panhandle, and the whole of Florida. The goal of this project is to increase the knowledge, skills and abilities of the library staff and volunteers so they can in turn, continue to facilitate, support and assist their library's patrons in meeting the patrons' information needs. PLAN will employ a multi-pronged approach to training library staff and volunteers. PLAN will offer a Curriculum of Classes – consisting of lecture and hands-on workshops delivered in a variety of ways, including face-to-face workshops, webinars and symposia. These classes will be conducted at member libraries throughout the region and online. Some workshops will be developed and delivered by PLAN staff while others will be offered by third party trainers. PLAN Academy Scholarships will be awarded to member library staff to attend workshops offered by others, e.g. professional organizations and associations.

Professional library trainers, as well as local experts from member libraries will be hired/engaged to provide training and share their expertise.
