Eligibility

The 2017 Teen Video Challenge for Florida is open only to legal U.S. residents aged 13 to 18 who are also residents of Florida. Participants are ineligible if directly related to the panel of judges for the contest. By participating, entrants agree to be bound by these contest rules.

Each participant or group may submit one video per entry. Each entry must include a signed model release form for each team member and for each person appearing in the video. All submissions must be mailed by Wednesday, March 1, 2017. Late entries will not be accepted. A DVD of the video will be requested from the winner.

Terms and Conditions

All music and artwork used must be freely available for legal use, sharing, repurposing and remixing and must be specified as such on the entry form. CSLP (and all CSLP member affiliates) have permission to use the 2017 Teen Video Challenge submissions, including all work created and all intellectual property embodied therein, as per the Model Release form.

Criteria for Video Acceptance

All videos must:

- Be 30 to 90 seconds long
- Promote the idea of using public libraries and reading
- Include your interpretation of the 2017 CSLP teen slogan, "Build a Better World"
- Be designed for use at any library
- Be appropriate for viewing by audiences of all ages

Criteria for Judging

- Creativity
- Message clarity and relevance
- Motivation and inspiration
- Overall impact
