## **Compound Last Names**

If you fail to check the box, your name will be listed with the name appearing last on the line. Example: John Jones Smith – If the last name has no hyphen and you do not check the box, the last name on the ballot would be "Smith". If you check the box, your last name would be listed on the ballot as "Jones Smith." If you have a hyphen within your last name, the last name would be listed as "Jones-Smith".
